

Key West is an island city that is part of the Florida Keys and is the southernmost piece of land in the continental United States. The island is located about 160 miles southwest of Miami and 90 miles north of Cuba and is bordered by both the Atlantic Ocean and the Gulf of Mexico. 


Near the Mallory Square and Pier B cruise docks, you'll find:


- Key West Museum of Art & History: The building was originally home to Key West's customs office, postal service, and district courts. Today, it is home to the headquarters of the Key West Art & Historical Society and two floors of exhibitions.
- 2. Clinton Square Market: A shopping mall that used to be a US Navy coal depot.
- 3. Key West Sponge Market
- 4. Key West Historic Memorial Sculpture Garden: Features busts of people who have had a significant impact on the city.
- 5. Mallory Square
- 6. Cayo Hueso y Habana Historeum: A cultural center that features a restaurant, gift shop, and museum that offer a glimpse into the island's Cuban heritage.
- 7. Kermit's Key West Key Lime Shoppe




- 8. Simonton Beach
- 9. Key West First Legal Rum Distillery: Claims to be Key West's first legal rum distillery.
- 10. Hemingway Rum Company's Papa's Pilar Rum Distillery
- 11. Kermit's Key West Key Lime Shoppe
- 12. Cuban Coffee Queen & Post Card Mural
- 13. Distance Marker Pole



- 14. South Beach
- 15. The Southernmost House Hotel: Built in the late 1800s as the southernmost private residence in the United States. It is now an adults-only hotel.
- 16. Southernmost Point of the Continental US: Large, iconic concrete buoy
- 17. Key West Lighthouse & Keeper's Quarters Museum: Built in 1848. Visitors can walk the 88 steps to the top for a fee to experience the highest viewpoint on Key West.
- 18. The Ernest Hemingway Home and Museum: Tours of the author's estate and gardens are available for a fee



- 19. Mile Marker 0: Marks the beginning -- and end -- of US Highway 1, which stretches from Key West to the Canadian border in Maine.
- 20. Birthplace of Pan American World Airways
- 21. Presidential Gates: Have welcomed US Presidents and other dignitaries since 1906.
- 22. Truman Little White House: Winter White House for President Harry S. Truman.
- 23. Captain George Carey House: Reportedly sits on the site where pirates discovered fresh water in the 1700s.
- 24. Duval Street
- 25. The Bull & Whistle Bar and the Garden of Eden Clothing-Optional Bar



- 26. Sloppy Joe's Bar: Has been at the corner of Duval Street and Greene Street since 1937.
- 27. Captain Tony's Saloon: Immortalized by Jimmy Buffet's song "Last Mango in Paris" and features numerous license plates, bras, and dollar bills attached to the ceiling. Original location of Sloppy Joe's Bar and was frequented by Ernest Hemingway at that time.
